Apply for the 2010 Davies—Jackson Scholarship!

The Council of Independent Colleges: Davies—Jackson Scholarship Program presents a unique opportunity for an outstanding student, who is first in his or her family to graduate from college, to participate in a course of study in the United Kingdom at St. John's College at Cambridge University, following their graduation.

Administered by the Council of Independent Colleges and supported by an anonymous benefactor, the Davies—Jackson Scholarship is designed especially for students from families with modest economic backgrounds. They seek applications from students who have demonstrated enthusiasm for and achievement in the arts, humanities, and social sciences, and who wish to pursue further substantive study in of these areas. The two-year, full scholarship to St. John's covers all tuition, fees, room and board during term-time, living expenses during summer vacation, and travel to and from England. The scholarship is open to students who wish to read Archeology and Anthropology, Classics, Economics, English, Geography, History, History of Art, Modern and Medieval Languages, Music, Philosophy, or Social and Political Sciences.

Applications are due by November 2, 2009. The applications should be made directly to the Davies—Jackson Scholarship Committee not to the University.
