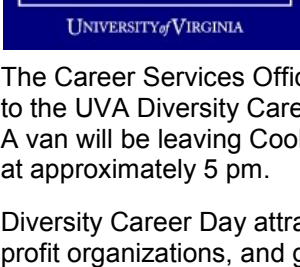

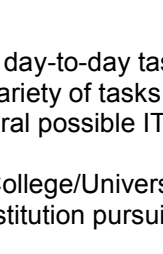

## Volunteer Alert!

The Youth Development Center (YDC) believes it is essential to value and support young people. The YDC is committed to providing area youth with the opportunity for recreational and educational programs focused on their total development.

The Youth Activity Building at the YDC was designed specifically with adolescents in mind. With 22,000 square feet of space, the facility boasts a full and half court gyms, game room, two snack bars with kitchens, mini-theater, two TV/computer lounges, meeting rooms and offices. The Activity Building has become a hub of activity for area young people. As advocates of a drug and alcohol-free lifestyle for adolescents, the YDC provides daily, weekly and monthly programs for adolescents; classes and seminars to develop life-long skills; Workforce Program; support for programs for teens and adults with disabilities; and rent free office space for eight youth nonprofit organizations. The facility is staffed 12 hours a day and is available to the community 24 hours a day, seven days a week.

Lend a hand... lend an hour as a volunteer at the YDC. Needs include:

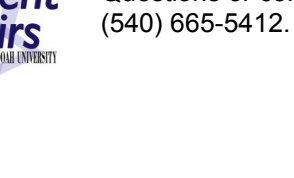

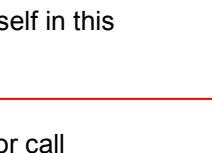
Career Services at Shenandoah University uses an on-line job posting system to alert students to part- and full-time jobs and internships. To join College Central Network, follow the instructions below.
