- 4. McKown Plaza:** Students will say good-bye to their families and friends after the free 5 p.m. Family Farewell Picnic.

Frequently Asked Move-In Day Questions

Well, here you are at Shenandoah University, about to embark on a new adventure. A lot of people have given you a lot of information through the admissions, enrollment and registration processes. But, have we answered all the really important questions such as “Where can I buy the things I forgot to bring today?” or “Where can I get a cup of coffee?”

After you’ve been directed to your residence hall, volunteers will be there to help you move everything from your car to your room. Whoever is driving the vehicle needs to stay with the car. Unloading happens quickly!

WHERE DO WE PARK THE CAR AFTER UNLOADING?

The driver can park the car near the Brandt Student Center (*see map on other side*), and meet the rest of his/her group back in the new student’s room. Drivers can also park in the Ohrstrom-Bryant Theatre lot or the lot next to Goodson Chapel.

WHERE DO STUDENTS PICK UP ROOM KEYS?

Rooms will be unlocked when students arrive. Keys will be distributed in residence hall lobbies, where students will meet their Resident Director (RD) and Resident Assistants (RAs). Get to know RDs and RAs; they are great people who have gone through extensive training so they can be really helpful to you.

WHAT HAPPENS IF A STUDENT HAS NO ASSIGNED ROOM?

The Residence Life Office is located in Cooley Hall. Someone will be available to assist you. Stop by or call (540) 665-4611, but please be patient, especially on Move-In Day.

HOW DO I GET SOMETHING FIXED IN MY ROOM?

Report any maintenance issues to the RA in your building. There will also be maintenance staff in residence halls on Move-In Day to address such needs.

WHERE DO WE PUT ALL THE EMPTY CARDBOARD BOXES?

Place empty boxes and other recyclables on the curb outside the residence hall. Recycling is an important part of life at Shenandoah.

WHERE CAN STUDENTS PICK UP I.D. CARDS?

Students who do not already have I.D. cards – which are needed to pick up laptops – should go to the Auxiliary Service Office on the west side of the Wilkins building. The big “SU” is your landmark.

WHAT DO WE DO AFTER CHECKING INTO THE RESIDENCE HALL?

Go to the Brandt Student Center. Take the green sheet you received when you got your room key. At the Brandt Student Center, employees from across campus will be waiting to help you with just about everything. You can pick up your

computer, purchase a parking permit, turn in forms, get your class schedule, buy textbooks, make payments, talk to Financial Aid staff, sign up for Welcome Week outdoor adventures and a lot more. And, yes, there will be coffee, cold drinks and food to purchase.

WHAT IF SOMEONE BECOMES ILL OR GETS INJURED?

The Wilkins Wellness Center is located on the west side of Racey Hall, ground floor, overlooking the center of campus. It has a red door and wood deck. Any employee or Residence Life staff member can direct you. The Department of Public Safety can be reached at (540) 678-4444.

IS THERE AN ATM ON CAMPUS?

Wachovia and BB&T machines are located on the main level of the Brandt Student Center.

WHAT ELSE SHOULD WE DO ON MOVE-IN DAY?

All families and friends of new students are invited to attend the New Student Convocation at 4 p.m. in the Smith Library Plaza. This event is followed by the Family Farewell Cookout at 5 p.m. in the McKown Plaza, located behind the Brandt Student Center. Everyone will say their good-byes at the picnic. By 7 p.m., all Welcome Week events are for students only.

WHERE CAN WE GET LUNCH TODAY?

Allen Dining Hall and the Brandt Student Center Food Court are open on Move-In Day. Of course, if you’re running out to purchase last-minute items, there are many restaurants close to campus. Read on.

WHERE ARE THE STORES?

Shenandoah University’s campus, in particular its Halpin-Harrison Hall, sits on the northeast corner of Millwood and Pleasant Valley avenues. Your other landmark at that corner is the Sheetz gas station and convenience store (where Shenandoah students frequently go on 2 a.m. Sheetz runs.) Head south on Pleasant Valley Avenue and find Kmart, Martin’s grocery store, Best Buy, Staples, Office Max, Lowe’s, Home Depot, Kohl’s, Target, T.J.Maxx, Walmart, Pier I, Bed Bath & Beyond and Michaels Craft as well as restaurants such as Ruby Tuesday, KFC, McDonald’s, Chili’s, Chipotle, Chic-fil-A, El Rancho, Olive Garden, Panera Bread, Red Lobster, T.G.I. Fridays... Well, you get the idea.
