

Most students major in biology, chemistry, exercise science, psychology or public health to prepare to apply to graduate health professions programs at Shenandoah and around the country. ACCELERATED OPTIONS TO GRADUATE DEGREES

We offer accelerated options to finish bachelor's degrees and/or accelerate to a graduate program here at SU!

BUSINESS

Our 4 + 1 option allows business students to earn an MBA with only one additional year of study.

PERFORMING ARTS

Music, theatre and dance students can earn a 4 + 1 Master of Science in Performing Arts Leadership & Management with one additional year of study.

THEOLOGY

Shenandoah and Wesley Theological Seminary offer a fast-track, 3+3 program for students interested in pursuing a master's degree in church and faith-based nonprofits leadership.

All students in the College of Arts & Sciences are required to have a minor as well as complete second-year, second-semester competency in a foreign language.

TRANSFER TO SHENANDOAH

Am I a Transfer Student?

You are considered a transfer student if:

- 1) you have attended another college or university after graduation from high school, or
- 2) if you have completed a bachelor's degree somewhere else and are applying for a second bachelor's degree.

Important Dates

FALL SEMESTER START

- Priority Accelerated Second Degree Nursing and Transfer Application Date: June 1
- First Tuition Payment Due: August 4

SPRING SEMESTER START

- Priority Accelerated Second Degree Nursing Application Date: October 1
- Priority Transfer Application Date: November 1
- First Tuition Payment Due: December 15

Applications are reviewed on a rolling basis. Your application will be reviewed after priority deadlines as long as there is space available in your program of choice.

Submit application materials:

 Official transcript(s) of credits earned at ALL colleges/universities previously attended.

You must have a minimum 2.0 cumulative GPA from all institutions you have attended, and be in good standing and eligible to return to your former institution. Some programs at Shenandoah (including nursing and the sciences) require a higher GPA and have additional coursework requirements.

 If you have fewer than 24 credits at other colleges/universities, high school transcripts are required. • Music, theatre or dance program applicants must also complete a required audition.

Many Shenandoah Conservatory programs do not allow spring semester entrance. Please check with the Office of Admissions to see which programs allow spring semester entrance.

Additional requirements may vary by academic program.

- Be sure to order your transcripts as early as possible, as it can take as long as **three weeks** for Shenandoah to receive official transcripts from other institutions.
- Once the Office of Admissions has received **ALL** of your required application materials, an admission decision can be made.

Will My Credits Transfer to Shenandoah?

The transfer admissions staff and Office of Advising will be happy to help you navigate transferring credits. Applicants may request a review by emailing an unofficial transcript to SUTran@su.edu prior to admission. This brief, preliminary review is subject to change.

You are also welcome to contact our transfer team to discuss specific courses and requirements while working through the admission process: **SUTran@su.edu or 540-665-4581.**

ONCE YOU ARE ADMITTED, we will officially evaluate transferable credit and provide a full transfer credit evaluation to you.

- Transfer credit is considered for courses in which a grade of C- or better has been earned.
- Official score report(s) for completed AP, IB or CLEP exams are reviewed for credit.
- Science credits will only transfer within a 10-year time period.
- We grant transfer credit for coursework completed at a college or university that is fully accredited by one of the six regional accrediting agencies, such as the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools.
- Credit may be granted for noncollegiate-sponsored instruction. This may include armed services and testing-service examinations, as recognized by the American Council on Education (ACE) credit recommendations.

FINANCIAL AID

We are committed to supporting our talented and diverse student body. The cost of a Shenandoah education is met by combining the resources of the university, parents, students, state and federal government aid, and other organizations. Financial aid can include:

- Academic merit transfer scholarships
- Need-based scholarships and grants
- Conservatory awards based on the results of the music, theatre or dance audition
- Virginia Tuition Assistance Grant (VTAG) for Virginia residents
- Virginia United Methodist Conference scholarships & ministerial grants
- Work-study program
- Federal and private loans

Estimated Cost of Attendance

The cost of attendance is our estimate of the total cost to attend Shenandoah for one academic year. This estimate includes tuition and fees, housing and meals, books and supplies, transportation expenses and personal expenses.

*Additional fees such as labs, music lessons or clinical placements are added to the cost of attendance, when appropriate, depending on the student's major. J-term and summer terms are not included here.
