A Part-Time, Two-Year Professional Degree Program (30 credit hours)

PROGRAM DESCRIPTION

The Education Administration concentration has two tracks: licensure and non-licensure. The licensure track is designed to meet the current and changing administrative needs of the public schools in Virginia and surrounding states. It incorporates the Virginia Licensure Regulations for School Personnel and the approved program standards of Virginia. The non-licensure track is designed for individuals in educational or equivalent settings who desire to know more about schools and school leadership but do not want to pursue a license. Private or independent school educators or international students may find the non-licensure track of interest. The program is offered online via Zoom. New cohorts are established annually in the Fall. The program operates on a Fall, Spring, and Summer semester system. A candidate can graduate in two years if they remain on schedule. Shenandoah University supports graduate study at the Master's level through a substantial tuition discount.

PROGRAM PREREQUISITES

- Bachelor's degree from a regionally accredited institution

ADMISSIONS REQUIREMENTS

- Graduate Application along with a \$30 non-refundable application fee
- Bachelor's Degree (minimum 3.0 GPA)
- Unofficial transcripts for initial admission from all institutions of higher education previously attended.
- Three letters of recommendation (one from an immediate supervisor)
- Essay addressing your background and educational goals (2-3 pages)
- Licensure Track: Valid teaching licensure, two years teaching experience, and access to schools
- Non-Licensure Track: experience in an educational setting or its equivalent
- Language Proficiency Requirement must be met. Submission of TOEFL, IELTS, PTE, or Duolingo English Test may be required. See our policy for full details: <https://www.su.edu/admissions/international-students>

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

Can this program be completed online?

Yes, courses are fully online. Class meets once per week via Zoom for about 3 hours each week.

How much does the program cost?

Tuition through the Division of Education and Leadership is offered at the discounted rate of \$465 per credit hour.

Can I complete this program while working full time?

Yes, all of our programs in the Division of Education & Leadership can be completed on a part-time basis, and many classes are offered in the evenings to accommodate working professionals. Most graduate students enrolled in DOEL programs also work full time.
