

Master of Science in Nursing

Family Nurse Practitioner

45 credits/600 clinical hours*

The Master of Science in Nursing (MSN): Family Nurse Practitioner (FNP) program is designed to provide nurses with the necessary education, competencies and experiences to assume the role of a primary health care provider in a variety of clinical settings. Didactic and clinical course content focuses on the assessment and management of health promotion and health maintenance strategies, risk reduction and common acute and chronic alterations in health status for individuals and families across the lifespan. The program can be completed in seven semesters and cohorts are established annually in the fall.



Nurse-Midwifery

49 credits/720 clinical hours* + experiences

Nurse-midwives are advanced practice nurses who provide family-centered primary health care to women throughout their reproductive lives, including counseling and care during pre-conception, pregnancy, childbirth, postpartum and the neonatal period. Midwifery is one of the most rewarding advanced practice nursing occupations, providing you with the framework to promote physiologic birth and affirm the power and strength of individuals while addressing their general health care. Shenandoah's Master of Science in Nurse-Midwifery prepares you with the necessary education and competencies to lead the profession in the promotion of high-quality, evidence-based midwifery care. The program can be completed full time in two years and cohorts are established annually in the fall.

Master of Science in Nursing Continued

Psychiatric Mental Health Nurse Practitioner

46 credits/600 clinical hours*

The Master of Science in Nursing (MSN): Psychiatric Mental Health Nurse Practitioner (PMHNP) program is designed to provide you with the necessary education, competencies, and experiences to assume the role of a PMHNP in a variety of clinical settings. The program consists of didactic and clinical course content essential to provide psychotherapy to individuals, families and groups within hospitals and community settings. Differential diagnoses, health promotion and psychotropic medication management (prescriptive authority) for the psychiatric mental health patient are addressed in this curriculum. The program can be completed in seven semesters and cohorts are established annually in the fall.

Clinical Experiences

We work with you to find clinical placements. This collaborative process between the student and placement team asks students to submit at least three preceptor or site referrals.



Post-Graduate Certificates

Our post-graduate certificates are designed for registered nurses who already hold a Master of Science in Nursing.

Family Nurse Practitioner

23-28 credits/600 clinical hours*

The Family Nurse Practitioner Certificate provides you with the necessary education, competencies and experiences to assume the role of a primary health care provider in a variety of clinical settings through both didactic and clinical courses. This program can be completed in five semesters and cohorts are established annually in the summer (or fall for the non-nurse practitioner applicants).

Psychiatric Mental Health Nurse Practitioner

24-29 credits/600 clinical hours*

The psychiatric mental health nurse practitioner serves as an educator, consultant, prescriber, therapist and researcher to enhance life quality for individuals with mental illness, and to prevent mental illness in high-risk populations such as children, the elderly and those with co-occurring medical illness and/or substance abuse. This program can be completed in five semesters and cohorts are established annually in the summer (or fall for the non-nurse practitioner track).

Nurse-Midwifery

26 credits/720 clinical hours* + experiences

Nurse-midwives are advanced practice nurses who provide family-centered primary health care to women throughout their reproductive lives, including counseling and care during pre-conception, pregnancy, childbirth, postpartum and the neonatal period. Midwifery is one of the most rewarding advanced practice nursing occupations, providing you with the framework to promote physiologic birth and affirm the power and strength of individuals while addressing their general health care. This program can be completed in three semesters and cohorts are established annually in the fall.

Doctor of Nursing Practice (DNP)

Shenandoah University's School of Nursing offers both BSN-to-DNP and Post-Master's DNP degrees.

Post-Baccalaureate Doctor of Nursing Practice (DNP)

The Post-Baccalaureate Doctor of Nursing Practice (DNP) with an FNP or PMHNP specialty is designed to provide individuals with the advanced knowledge, skills and experiences needed to perform at the highest level of clinical nursing practice.

- **Family Nurse Practitioner**

The program can be completed in nine consecutive semesters at full-time status.

- **Psychiatric Mental Health Nurse Practitioner**

The program can be completed in nine consecutive semesters at full-time status.

Post-Graduate Doctor of Nursing Practice (DNP)

35 credits/500 clinical hours*

The Post-Graduate Doctor of Nursing Practice (DNP) is designed to prepare individuals with the advanced knowledge, meanings and experiences to perform at the highest level of clinical nursing practice.

The Post-Graduate DNP program is open to all advanced practice registered nurses (nurse practitioners, certified nurse-midwives, clinical nurse specialists and certified registered nurse anesthetists) who hold a master's degree and are nationally certified as an APRN (NP, CNS), CNM or CRNA. The program can be completed in six semesters and cohorts are established annually in the fall.

Clinical Experiences

We work with you to find clinical placements. This collaborative process between the student and placement team asks students to submit at least three preceptor or site referrals.

**Note: Due to changes in national standards, for students beginning clinicals in Fall 2024 or later, the clinical hours requirements will likely increase to at least 780 hours.*
