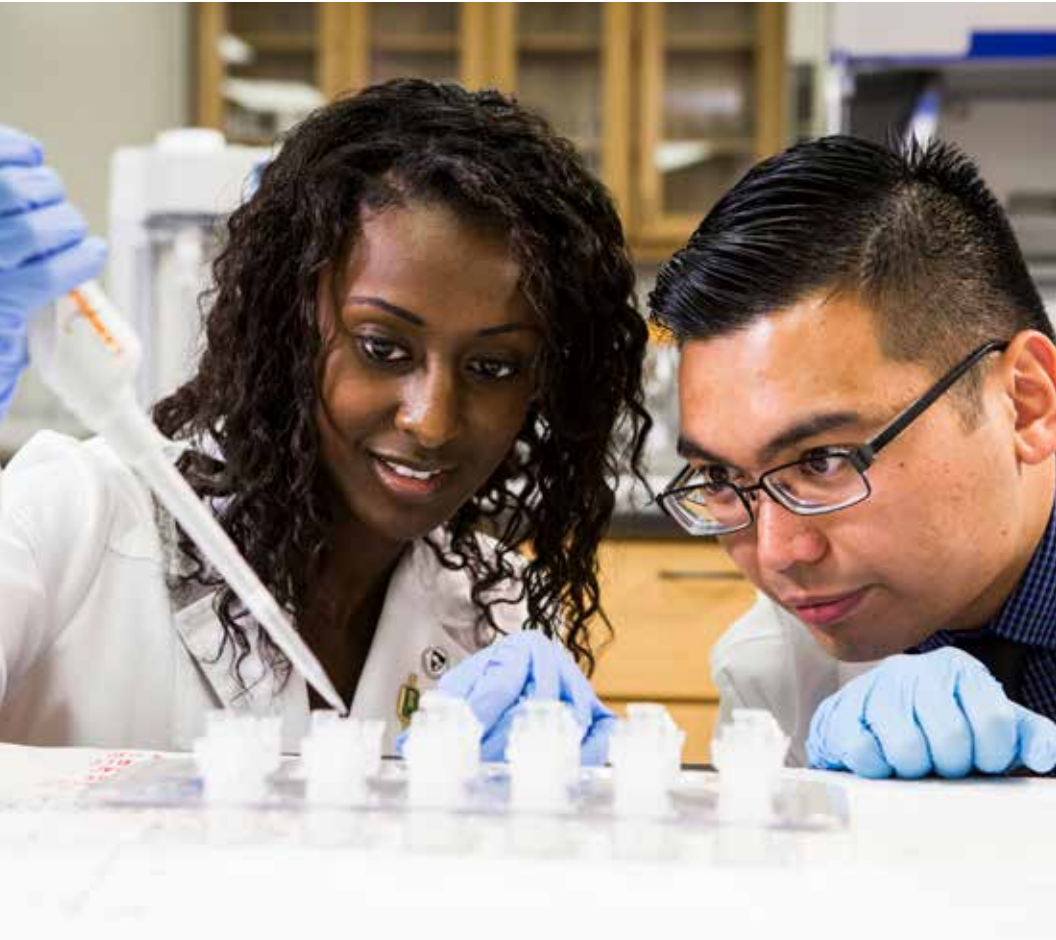

MESSAGE FROM THE DEAN

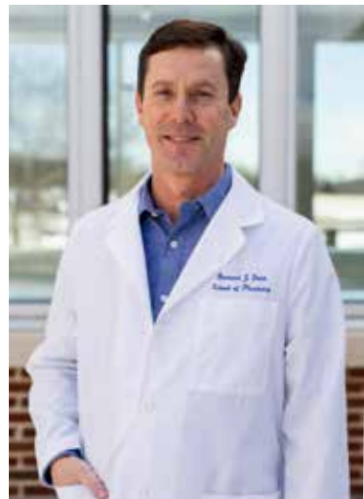

Pharmacy Profession

GRADUATE PROGRAMS

• Doctor of Pharmacy (Pharm.D.)

- **Traditional pathway:** provides in-person learning at our Winchester, Virginia location.
- **Online pathway:** will allow students to engage in much of the didactic curriculum asynchronously (on your own time), with some synchronous (live) online sessions and two on-campus visits per semester.

This pathway is pending ACPE approval.

• Nontraditional Doctor of Pharmacy (Pharm.D.)

- This is a post-professional pathway designed for U.S. licensed and practicing pharmacists and is fully online.

DUAL DEGREE PROGRAMS

• Pharm.D. & Master of Business Administration (MBA)

- This dual degree is designed to provide students seeking leadership positions with management skills through our AACSB International-accredited MBA.

• Pharm.D. & Master of Public Health (MPH)

- This dual program prepares students to enter a wide range of pharmacy and public health positions that address today's most challenging population health issues.

• Pharm.D. & Master of Science in Pharmacogenomics

- This dual degree prepares students to apply knowledge of the human genome to clinical practice for career opportunities in biologic technology, at genetic testing laboratories, or within the pharmaceutical industry.

Learn from Accomplished Professionals

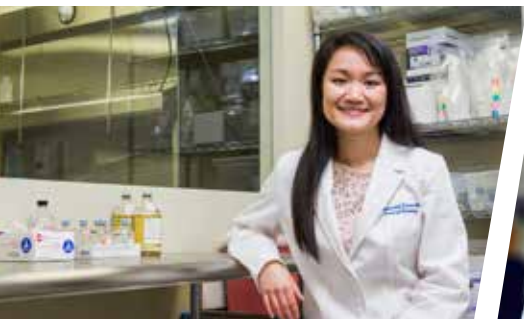

Shenandoah University, in partnership with Valley Health and the Virginia Department of Health's Lord Fairfax Health District, administered more than 70,000 COVID-19 vaccine shots from January to May 2021, at the mass-vaccination clinic at the university's James R. Wilkins, Jr. Athletics & Events Center. Shenandoah pharmacy faculty and students were central to this endeavor. School of Pharmacy faculty also developed a saliva surveillance test to determine COVID-19 prevalence in the Shenandoah community and conducted genetic testing to identify variants in positive test samples.
