Graduate Programs

Master of Science in Athletic Training

Our Master of Science in Athletic Training (MSAT) is a two-year, 70-credit degree program accredited by the Commission on Accreditation of Athletic Training Education (CAATE). The program offers a hybrid learning experience (summer on-campus instruction, hybrid fall and spring semesters), providing a strong foundation in anatomy, kinesiology, and injury pathomechanics. The program prepares you to take the Board of Certification (BOC) exam in athletic training and boasts a three-year aggregate 97% first-time board pass rate.

Dual Degree: Master of Science in Athletic Training/ Doctor of Physical Therapy

Our dual degree in athletic training and physical therapy is one of the only programs in the country designed for students interested in joining both professions and becoming a sports medicine expert clinician. This four-year program, offered at our locations in Winchester and Leesburg, Virginia, prepares you to meet the standards to take the physical therapy licensure exam and the athletic training Board of Certification (BOC) exam. Courses are shared between programs when didactic coursework overlaps between the two professions.

Health care professionals and current students can specialize their skill sets by taking advantage of any of our four, 15-credit, hybrid graduate certificates. Performing Arts Medicine and Esports Medicine aim to educate health care professionals on the prevention, assessment, and management of injuries and disorders specific to dancers, theatre artists, musicians or esports athletes while the Performing Arts Health & Fitness and Esports Health & Fitness certificates focus on preventing injury/illness, providing strength and conditioning, understanding nutritional needs and integrating mind and body techniques to enhance health and wellness for performing artists and esports athletes.

The **Health & Life Sciences Building** in Winchester, Virginia anchors the south corner of main campus, providing a state-of-the-art facility for the natural sciences and health care education.

Our **cutting-edge esports arena** accommodates the growing esports demand in the region. It serves as both a practice facility for Shenandoah's 55+-member varsity team and as a public esports venue where spectators can watch weekly matches.

The James R. Wilkins, Jr. Athletics & Events Center is the home of the Shenandoah basketball, volleyball, and track & field teams, and offers student-athletes the opportunity to practice, train and receive treatment in all conditions. This facility includes several basketball and volleyball courts, a 6-lane track and a satellite athletic training area.

Our Performing Arts Health & Fitness and Esports Health & Fitness graduate certificates are designed to improve teaching within performing arts and esports, to increase performance while mitigating injury risk and to promote business opportunities for a fitness professional or massage therapist catering to the needs of a performing artist or esports athlete. These programs prepare you to be a leader in performing arts and esports health and fitness.
