Master of Science in Nursing: Family Nurse Practitioner



A synchronous online, part-time, 2.5-year professional degree program (48 credits)

PROGRAM DESCRIPTION

The Master of Science in Nursing (MSN) Family Nurse Practitioner (FNP) program is designed to provide the bachelor's level educated nurse with the necessary knowledge, skills, values, meanings, and experiences to assume the role of a primary health care provider in a variety of clinical settings. Didactic and clinical course content focuses on the assessment and management of health promotion and health maintenance strategies, risk reduction, common acute and chronic alterations in health status for individuals and families across the lifespan. Upon successful completion of the program, the student will be eligible to take the national certification exam given by either the American Nurses Credentialing Center (ANCC) or the American Academy of Nurse Practitioners (AANP).

PROGRAM PREREQUISITES

- A bachelor's degree in nursing (BSN) from a CCNE or an ACEN accredited institution. Recommended 3.0 cumulative GPA.
- Applicants must have completed or will complete the following prerequisite course requirements prior to enrolling at Shenandoah:
 - Undergraduate Health Assessment, Pathophysiology, and Pharmacology courses. Recommended grade of "B" or better.
 - Undergraduate Statistics course with a grade of "C" or better within the last five years.
 - Undergraduate Chemistry course with grade of "C" or better.

ADMISSIONS REQUIREMENTS

- Graduate Application with \$30 application fee.
- Unofficial transcripts from all institutions for initial admission
- Unencumbered RN license (*multi-state preferred*)
- Current resume/C.V.
- Documentation of one year of direct patient care prior to specialty courses
- Essay (250-500 words): Why are you choosing to pursue the FNP role?
- Three letters of recommendation
 - One from previous faculty (if graduated in the last five years)
 - Two professional references to attest to clinical experience
- Language proficiency must be met. Submission of TOEFL, IELTS, PTE, or Duolingo English Test may be required. See our policy for full details: <u>https://www.su.edu/admissions/international-students</u>
- A recorded video introduction/interview will be required.

If admitted, the admissions will be provisional until the completion of all required health records, documentation of up-to-date required immunizations, completion and acceptable Criminal Background Check and a negative urine drug screen. Proof of valid CPR certification from AHA is also a requirement for admission.

For international students who require a visa, due to limited on-campus hours, **F-1 visas are not issued for this program.**

Format/Location

Synchronous online courses meet one day each week.

An immersion experience may be required during the fall and spring semesters at the Winchester Main Campus.
