# Professional Studies Certificate: Health and Physical Education K-12



A Full-time, Two-Year Certificate Program (39 credit hours)

#### PROGRAM DESCRIPTION

The Professional Studies Certificate Program (PSC) for Health and Physical Education serves students who want to obtain Virginia Teacher Licensure. This PSC program is intended to meet the Virginia Department of Education (VDOE) requirements for licensure in the health and physical education PreK-12 endorsement area. The PSC in Health and Physical Education is offered in the Fall, Spring, and Summer terms. Program entry requires meeting the undergraduate Kinesiology Health and Physical Education PreK-12 content courses, as well as Adapted Physical Education (KNS 481).

#### **PROGRAM PREREQUISITES**

Bachelor's degree with a minimum 3.0 cumulative GPA

### **ADMISSIONS REQUIREMENTS**

- Graduate Application with a \$30 non-refundable application fee
- Bachelor's Degree (minimum 3.0 GPA)
- Unofficial transcripts for initial admission from all institutions of higher education previously attended.
- Three letters of recommendation
- Essay addressing your background and educational goals (2-3 pages)
- Praxis Academic Core Tests (and appropriate substitutes) are no longer required as entrance exams for graduate teacher education programs at Shenandoah University. Instead, students will complete the VCLA and Praxis 2 exams during the course of the program. If you have already taken the VCLA or would like to take it prior to applying, you are encouraged to submit your scores with your application.
