Professional Studies Certificate: Special Education, Add-on Endorsements K-6, 6-8, 6-12



A Part-time, One-Year Certificate Program (15 credit hours)

PROGRAM DESCRIPTION

The Professional Studies Certificates in Special Education K-6, 6-8, or 6-12 Addon Endorsements serve licensed teachers who desire to add Virginia Special Education Endorsement at their licensure level. The PSCs in SPED K-6, 6-8, and 6-12 include the use of the newest instructional techniques experiential leaning and exposure to information related to classroom management, and instructional strategies for deliver to K-6, 6-8, or 6-12 grade populations. Teachers completing this program will meet the Virginia Department of Education (VDOE) requirements for grade-banded, add-on endorsement in one of the three: Special Education Elementary K-6, Middle 6-8, or Secondary 6-12 instruction.

To complete an add-on endorsement in Special Education K-6, 6-8, or 6-12, teachers must earn 15 credits as noted in the lists below. Fifty hours of field experiences are embedded in the courses for each endorsement. The certificate requirement is 15 semester hours with a grade point average of 3.0 or better.

Bachelor's degree with a minimum 3.0 cumulative GPA

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

How much does the program cost?

Tuition through the Division of Education and Leadership is offered at the discounted rate of \$490 per credit hour for the 2025-2026 Academic Year.

Can I complete this program while working full time?

Yes, all of our programs in the Division of Education & Leadership can be completed on a part-time basis, and all classes are offered in the evenings to accommodate working professionals. Most graduate students enrolled in DOEL programs also work full time.

Are courses in person or online?

Classes are online synchronous with the possibility of some asynchronous weeks. They are one day a week for 2.5 hours. Synchronous classes are interactive and engaging and include group and individual work. The formats include lectures, interactive discussions, videos, and problem-solving activities. Some classes include practicum hours that students may apply in their current teaching positions. Students not currently teaching will be placed for practicum hours.
