### ► Master of Science in Physician Assistant Studies (MSPAS)

# APPLIED BEHAVIOR ANALYSIS

### College of Arts & Sciences

Applied behavior analysis (ABA) is an evidence-based approach to teaching and behavior support that involves analyzing and understanding the unique personal and environmental circumstances that influence and affect one's behavior.

Our ABA programs teach students to conduct ABA therapy from a place of compassion with an emphasis on individualized client-centered and assent-based procedures. Students learn how to utilize ABA approaches for a variety of individuals and contexts, including supporting neurodivergent learners, students in the classroom, and employees in business and organizational settings.

### **Key Features:**

- Designed to accommodate individuals who are employed full or part time
- Fully online program with classes utilizing both asynchronous and synchronous elements
- Curricula designed to meet both the 5th and 6th Edition coursework requirements, as mandated by the behavior analyst certification board
- \$50,000-\$100,000 starting salary range for BCBAs
- Nationally and regionally renowned faculty mentors

- Programs meet behavior-analytic coursework requirements for BCBA and BCaBA certification.
- Certified by the International Behavior Analysis Organization (IBAO), which allows international students to complete the academic requirements to sit for the IBAO's certification exam
- BCBA career options include, but are not limited to: clinical supervisor, school-support personnel, parent trainer, behavior consultant, health coach, researcher, ABA therapist, social worker, or nonprofit sector work

### ► Master of Science in Applied Behavior Analysis (MS ABA)

Our MS ABA is designed to develop the necessary knowledge, skills and ethical standards. Our program consists of 33 credit hours, including 21 credit hours of required coursework, 6 credit hours of electives, and 6 credit hours for a final capstone project. Students arrange their own fieldwork supervision with recommendations and support from SU faculty.

# CLINICAL MENTAL HEALTH COUNSELING





Clinical mental health counselors work with their clients to establish goals and develop approaches to address emotional issues, shore up skills in coping and communication, improve self-esteem, promote changes in behavior and strive for improved mental well-being.

### ► Master of Science in Clinical Mental Health Counseling (MS)

Our 60-credit MS in Clinical Mental Health Counseling program provides students with the knowledge and skills to deliver individual and group counseling services grounded in evidence-based practices. Students develop their theoretical orientation through coursework, practicum experiences, and internships and will learn ethical and legal foundations as well as diverse content to work with varied clientele and diagnoses.

### **Key Features:**

- Career growth is expected in substance abuse, behavioral disorders, and mental health counseling, according to the Bureau of Labor Statistics; Occupational Outlook Handbook

- Collaboration with graduate health professions students in other disciplines at Shenandoah to understand biological, psychological, social and environmental factors impacting health and development
- Part-time option available for working professionals

### ► Master of Arts in Music Therapy and Professional Counseling (MA)

The Master of Arts in Music Therapy and Professional Counseling integrates clinical mental health counseling and music therapy coursework to provide a comprehensive education emphasizing ethical and culturally responsive treatment strategies. This degree fulfills the academic requirements to become a nationally board certified music therapist (MT-BC) and licensed professional counselor (LPC) in Virginia.

# **NURSING**

# School of Nursing

### Master of Science in Nursing (MSN)

Our MSN program offers three distinct specialties in cohorts that are established annually in the fall semester.

### **Key Features:**

- Online, synchronous courses that meet one day each week
- Immersion experiences in-person at our Winchester campus to ensure students build critical person-to-person health care skills
- Clinical placement is a collaborative process between the student and the faculty
- Small cohort sizes of 15-20 students per specialty
- Experienced faculty who are active practitioners
- Near-perfect licensure exam pass rates in all three specialty areas

### ▶ Family Nurse Practitioner (FNP)

47 Credits/ 600 clinical hours

The MSN FNP program is designed to provide nurses with the necessary education, competencies and experiences to assume the role of a primary health care provider in a variety of clinical settings. The program can be completed in seven semesters.

### > Nurse-Midwifery

46 credits/720 clinical hours + experiences

Nurse-midwives are advanced practice nurses who provide family-centered primary health care to women throughout their reproductive lives, including counseling and care during pre-conception, pregnancy, childbirth, postpartum and the neonatal period. Midwifery is one of the most rewarding advanced practice nursing occupations, providing you with the framework to promote physiologic birth and affirm the power and strength of individuals while addressing their general health care. The program can be completed full-time in two years.

### ▶ Psychiatric Mental Health Nurse Practitioner (PMHNP)

46 Credits/ 600 clinical hours

The MSN PMHNP program is designed to provide nurses with the necessary education, competencies, and experiences to assume the role of a PMHNP in a variety of settings. The program consists of didactic and clinical course content essential to provide pharmacotherapy and psychotherapy to individuals, families and groups within hospitals and community settings. The program can be completed in seven semesters.

### **ABSN - Accelerated Second Degree in Nursing**

### ► Doctor of Nursing Practice (DNP)

33 credits/540 practicum hours

The MSN-to-DNP is designed to prepare clinical nurses with the advanced knowledge and experiences necessary to manage health care in a safe, effective, and efficient manner in a variety of settings. This is an asynchronous online program with individual faculty mentorship.

Cultural insight is an essential component in providing high-quality health care.

Knowing this, Shenandoah offers international opportunities for its students in the health professions each year, a dedicated interprofessional group of health professionals and SU students provides health care to rural communities on a service and learning trip to Nicaragua. The team also provides oral health preventive care for several hundred children.

Our nursing program has traveled regularly to provide care to communities along the Amazon River in South America, and athletic training students routinely study and learn in Ireland. Health professions students also have engaged in experiential learning in recent years in Belize, Cuba, Ghana, Guatemala, Kenya and Morocco.

# INTERPROFESSIONAL EDUCATION FOR THE HEALTH PROFESSIONS

As a student in any of our graduate-level health care programs, you'll learn in an interprofessional environment that prepares you to operate as an essential member of a multidisciplinary health care team.

Faculty and students spanning all of our graduate health care programs meet once a semester and gain new perspectives as they discuss case studies and ideas about patient care and treatment.

Additionally we offer students unique opportunities to work with programs in virtual reality as well as with our renowned Shenandoah Conservatory – through which health care students learn to provide care for performing artists or explore how the performing arts can play a role in healing and wellness.

Several different health care and arts disciplines collaborate to provide care at our Shenandoah Performing Arts Rehab Center (SPARC).

Shenandoah is the first college or university in Virginia to have offered graduate health-related certificates in the cutting-edge world of esports. These programs enhance practitioners' knowledge and skills to provide injury prevention and identification, as well as treatment of esport athletes.
