# Professional Studies Certificate in Administration & Supervision



A Part-time, Two-Year Certificate Program (21 credit hours)

# **PROGRAM DESCRIPTION**

The Professional Studies Certificate in Administration & Supervision is designed to meet the current and changing administrative needs of the public and private schools in Virginia and surrounding states. It incorporates the Virginia Licensure Regulations for School Personnel and the approved program standards of Virginia. The program is designed for those who already have earned a master's degree in a field other than school administration and want to meet the Virginia requirements for licensure in administration and supervision. This program is offered online via Zoom. New cohorts are established annually in the Fall. The program operates year round. A candidate can graduate in two years if they remain on schedule. Shenandoah University supports graduate study at the Master's level through a substantial tuition discount.

Master's degree with a minimum 3.0 cumulative GPA

# **ADMISSIONS REQUIREMENTS**

- Graduate Application with a \$30 non-refundable application fee
- Master's Degree (minimum 3.0 GPA)
- Unofficial transcripts for initial admission from all institutions of higher education previously attended.
- Current teaching license valid in any U.S. state
- One letter of recommendation
- Essay addressing your background and educational goals (2-3 pages)
- Resume
- Two years teaching experience and access to schools

# Can I complete this program while working full time?

Yes, all of our programs in the Division of Education & Leadership can be completed on a part-time basis, and many classes are offered in the evenings to accommodate working professionals. Most graduate students enrolled in DOEL programs also work full time.
