Professional Studies Certificate: Middle School Teacher Education Licensure



A Full-time, Two-Year Certificate Program (36 credit hours)

PROGRAM DESCRIPTION

The Professional Studies Certificate (PSC) program for Elementary, Middle, and/or Secondary Teacher Education licensure serves students who want to obtain Virginia Teacher Licensure. These PSC programs are intended to meet the Virginia Department of Education (VDOE) requirements for licensure in at least one endorsement area in which the University offers programs. Elementary licensure is offered for PreK-6, and Middle licensure is offered for grades 6-8. Secondary licensure is offered in Biology, Business Education, Chemistry, English, History/Social Studies, Mathematics, and Spanish. PreK-12 licensure is offered in Health and Physical Education. To complete the PSC, candidates must earn 24-36 credits (depending on endorsement/licensure area). Up to 18 credits earned to complete the PSC may be transferred into the Master of Science in Education – Individualized Focus degree, allowing the candidate to complete both licensure and graduate degree requirements. Students must undergo a Criminal Background Check in order to successfully complete this program.

PROGRAM PREREQUISITES

Bachelor's degree with a minimum 3.0 cumulative GPA

ADMISSIONS REQUIREMENTS

- Graduate Application with a \$30 non-refundable application fee
- Bachelor's Degree (minimum 3.0 GPA)
- Unofficial transcripts for initial admission from all institutions of higher education previously attended.
- One letter of recommendation
- Essay addressing your background and educational goals (2-3 pages)
- Resume
- Language Proficiency Requirement must be met. Submission of TOEFL, IELTS, PTE, or Duolingo English Test may be required. See our policy for full details: https://www.su.edu/admissions/international-students
- Praxis Academic Core Tests (and appropriate substitutes) are no longer required as entrance exams for graduate teacher education programs at Shenandoah University. Instead, students will complete the Praxis 2 exams during the course of the program.
- An undergraduate transcript review is also required to determine if there
 are any undergraduate courses that need to be completed prior to student
 teaching
