Professional Studies Certificate for Reading Licensure



A Part-time, Two-Year Certificate Program (21 credit hours)

PROGRAM DESCRIPTION

The Professional Studies Certificate (PSC) for Reading Licensure serves teachers who already hold a master's degree from a regionally accredited institution of higher education and who want to obtain Virginia licensure as a reading specialist without seeking Shenandoah University's Master of Science in Literacy Education: Reading Concentration degree. Students completing the requirements for the PSC for Reading Licensure will meet the Virginia Department of Education (VDOE) approved program requirements for licensure. New cohorts are established in the Fall, Spring, and Summer terms, and the program operates on a Fall, Spring, and Summer semester system.

PROGRAM PREREQUISITES

Master's degree with a minimum 3.0 cumulative GPA

ADMISSIONS REQUIREMENTS

- Graduate Application with a \$30 non-refundable application fee
- Master's Degree (minimum 3.0 GPA)
- Unofficial transcripts for initial admission from all institutions of higher education previously attended.
- One administrative letter of recommendation
- Essay addressing your background and educational goals (2-3 pages)
- Current teaching license
- Resume
- Two years teaching experience and access to schools
- Language Proficiency Requirement must be met. Submission of TOEFL, IELTS, PTE, or Duolingo English Test may be required. See our policy for full details: https://www.su.edu/admissions/international-students

Can this program be completed online?

Tuition through the Division of Education and Leadership is offered at the discounted rate.

Can I complete this program while working full time?

Yes, all of our programs in the Division of Education & Leadership can be completed on a part-time basis, and many classes are offered in the evenings to accommodate working professionals. Most graduate students enrolled in DOEL programs also work full time.
