► Master of Science in Physician Assistant Studies (MSPAS)

The Shenandoah University Physician Assistant (SUPA) program is a graduate entry-level professional course of study enabling individuals who hold baccalaureate degrees to become PAs. The program is designed to prepare graduates for practice and a team approach to the delivery of healthcare. The program integrates graduate-level critical thinking and analysis, problem solving, scientific inquiry, self-directed learning and the effective use of modern technology for professional practice that includes elements of research, leadership, education and continued enhancement of the PA profession.

DUAL DEGREES

► Physician Assistant/Master of Public Health (MS/MPH)

Our dual-degree program emphasizes a medical curriculum that prepares PA students to apply broad knowledge and basic skills in public health in as little as three additional full-time semesters. There is also an option to complete the MPH on a part-time basis.

Pharmacists are medication experts who enhance patient care and promote wellness. They also compound personalized medications, participate in patient rounds at the hospital, reduce the spread of infections, conduct research or clinical trials, and can specialize in a specific patient population or disease state.

Learn from nationally recognized faculty and build on knowledge through application of evidence-based clinical decisions and critical thinking skills to prepare for current and emerging PT practice and roles in academia.

This program prepares you to meet the standards to take the National Physical Therapy Exam (NPTE) and the athletic training Board of Certification (BOC) exam.

► Doctor of Physical Therapy (DPT) to Master of Science in Athletic Training (MSAT) Bridge Program

The Bridge Program within our Division of Athletic Training is a 14-month, hybrid program designed exclusively for already licensed DPT practitioners who are seeking certification as an athletic trainer. This accelerated program recognizes the clinical foundation from the DPT program and builds upon it with focused education in injury prevention, acute and emergency care, and healthcare delivery in sports medicine environments.

This program is delivered through a flexible combination of asynchronous coursework, on-campus workshops, and immersive clinical experiences. Students engage in advanced clinical reasoning, sideline management, interprofessional collaboration, and evidence-based practice. Currently enrolled DPT students in their final year are also eligible for this bridge program but entry-level applicants should pursue the dual degree.

OCCUPATIONAL THERAPY

School of Health Professions

Occupational therapists evaluate and treat people who have injuries, illnesses, or disabilities. They help clients meet goals to develop, recover, improve, and maintain skills needed for daily living and working.

► Master of Science in Occupational Therapy (MSOT)

Our 75-credit MSOT program prepares you to become a skilled and compassionate occupational therapist, serving a diverse range of conditions in a variety of healthcare and community-based settings.

The MSOT program is offered in two formats:

- Hybrid with courses one day each week at our Loudoun campus in Leesburg, Virginia.

► Doctor of Occupational Therapy (OTD)

Our 100-credit, entry-level OTD program not only prepares you to become a skilled and compassionate occupational therapist, but it also offers additional focus on clinical practice skills, research skills, administration, leadership, policy development and advocacy. In addition, doctoral students complete a culminating capstone project.

APPLIED BEHAVIOR ANALYSIS

College of Arts & Sciences

Applied behavior analysis (ABA) is an evidence-based approach to teaching and behavior support that involves analyzing and understanding the unique personal and environmental circumstances that influence and affect one's behavior.

Our ABA programs teach students to conduct ABA therapy from a place of compassion with an emphasis on individualized, client-centered and assent-based procedures. Students learn how to utilize ABA approaches for a variety of individuals and contexts, including supporting neurodivergent learners, students in the classroom, and employees in business and organizational settings.

CLINICAL MENTAL HEALTH COUNSELING

School of Health Professions

Clinical mental health counselors work with clients to establish goals and develop approaches to address emotional issues, develop and strengthen skills in coping and communication, improve self-esteem, promote changes in behavior and strive for improved mental well-being.

► Master of Science in Clinical Mental Health Counseling (MS)

Our 60-credit MS in Clinical Mental Health Counseling program provides students with the knowledge and skills to deliver individual and group counseling services grounded in evidence-based practices. Students develop their theoretical orientation through coursework, practicum experiences, and internships and will learn ethical and legal foundations as well as diverse content to work with varied clientele and diagnoses. This degree fulfills the academic requirements to become a licensed professional counselor (LPC) in Virginia.

► Master of Arts in Music Therapy and Professional Counseling (MA)

The Master of Arts in Music Therapy and Professional Counseling integrates clinical mental health counseling and music therapy coursework to provide a comprehensive education emphasizing ethical and culturally responsive treatment strategies. This degree fulfills the academic requirements to become a nationally board-certified music therapist (MT-BC) and licensed professional counselor (LPC) in Virginia.

Our 60-credit School Counseling program prepares students to become professional school counselors equipped to support the academic, career, and personal/social development of children and adolescents in PreK-12 educational settings. The School Counseling program is approved by the Virginia Department of Education and the degree fulfills the academic requirements to become a licensed school counselor in Virginia.

Our MSN program offers three distinct specialties in cohorts that start annually in the fall semester.

► **Family Nurse Practitioner (FNP)**

47 credits/ 600 clinical hours

The MSN FNP program is designed to provide nurses with the necessary education, competencies and experiences to assume the role of a primary health care provider in a variety of clinical settings. The program can be completed in seven semesters.

► **Nurse-Midwifery**

46 credits/ 720 clinical hours + experiences

Nurse-midwives are advanced practice nurses who provide family-centered primary healthcare to women throughout their reproductive lives, including counseling and care during pre-conception, pregnancy, childbirth, postpartum and the neonatal period. The program provides the midwifery framework to promote physiologic birth in hospitals and out-of-hospital community births focusing on rural, underserved areas. The program can be completed full-time in two years.

► **Psychiatric Mental Health Nurse Practitioner (PMHNP)**

46 credits/ 600 clinical hours

The MSN PMHNP program is designed to provide nurses with the necessary education, competencies, and experiences to assume the role of a PMHNP in a variety of settings. The program consists of didactic and clinical course content essential to provide pharmacotherapy and psychotherapy to individuals, families and groups within hospitals and community settings. The program can be completed in seven semesters.

ABSN - Accelerated Second Degree in Nursing

► Doctor of Nursing Practice (DNP)

33 credits/540 practicum hours

The MSN-to-DNP prepares advanced practice nurses for the highest level of clinical practice, leadership, and system-level healthcare improvement. This is an asynchronous online program.

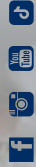
