AP, IB HIGHER-LEVEL & CLEP EXAMS

Shenandoah accepts credit from the Advanced Placement program (AP), the International Baccalaureate Examination program (IB) for higher-level courses, and the College-Level Examination Program (CLEP). Students who have been officially admitted to Shenandoah must submit official copies of test results to be considered for credit.

TRANSFER TO SU!

Am I a transfer student?

You are considered a transfer student if:

- 1) you have attended another college or university after graduation from high school, or
- 2) you have completed a bachelor's degree somewhere else and are applying for a second bachelor's degree.

APPLICATION FOR ADMISSION SU.EDU/APPLY

Shenandoah offers an application that can be submitted directly through our website. Students can begin and save their progress, to return and complete at any time.

SU does not accept transfer applications through Common App.

Submit application materials:

- Official transcript(s) of credits earned at ALL colleges/universities previously attended. We recommend a minimum 2.0 cumulative GPA from all institutions you have attended, and you must be in good standing and eligible to return to your former institution. Some programs at SU (including nursing and the sciences) require a higher GPA and have additional coursework requirements.
- If you have fewer than 24 credits at other colleges/universities, high school transcripts are required.
- Music, theatre or dance program applicants must also complete a required audition.

Many Shenandoah Conservatory programs do not allow spring semester entrance. Please check with the Office of Admissions to see which programs allow spring semester entrance.

- Additional requirements may vary by academic program.



IMPORTANT DATES FOR ADMISSION

FALL SEMESTER START

- **February 15:** Priority application date for Accelerated Second Degree Nursing applications
- **June 10:** Priority application date for all transfer applications
- **August 5:** Tuition and fees payment due

Applications are reviewed on a rolling basis. Your application will be reviewed after priority deadlines as long as there is space available in your program of choice.

SPRING SEMESTER START

- **October 1:** Priority application date for Accelerated Second Degree Nursing applications
- **November 1:** Priority application date for all transfer applications
- **December 15:** Tuition and fees payment due

WILL MY CREDITS TRANSFER TO SU?

The transfer admissions staff and Office of Advising will help you navigate transferring credits.

You are welcome to contact our transfer team to discuss specific courses and requirements while working through the admission process at SUTran@su.edu or 540-665-4581. Applicants may request an unofficial transcript review by emailing an unofficial transcript to SUTran@su.edu prior to admission. This brief, preliminary review is subject to change based on official transcripts.

ONCE YOU ARE ADMITTED, we will officially evaluate transferable credit and provide a full transfer credit evaluation to you.

- Transfer credit is considered for courses in which a grade of C- or better has been earned.
- Official score report(s) for completed AP, IB or CLEP exams are reviewed for credit.
- Science credits will only transfer within a 10-year time period.
- We grant transfer credit for coursework completed at a college or university that is fully accredited by one of the six regional accrediting agencies, such as the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools.
- Credit may be granted for noncollegiate-sponsored instruction. This may include armed services and testing-service examinations, as recognized by the American Council on Education (ACE) credit recommendations.

SHENANDOAH IS AFFORDABLE

Shenandoah is committed to supporting its talented and diverse student body. The cost of a Shenandoah education is met by combining the resources of parents and students with aid from state and federal governments, the university, and other organizations. This includes:

- Academic merit transfer scholarships
- Need-based scholarships and grants
- Conservatory awards based on the results of music, theatre or dance auditions
- Virginia Tuition Assistance Grant (VTAG) for Virginia residents
- Virginia United Methodist Conference scholarships & ministerial grants
- Work-study program
- Federal and private loans

APPLYING FOR FINANCIAL AID

You must apply for financial aid in order to receive it.

Complete the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA). The FAFSA is used to determine eligibility for aid such as grants, student and parent loans, and work-study.

- **For Spring Semester 2027:** use the 2026-27 FAFSA
- **For Fall Semester 2027:** use the 2027-28 FAFSA

COST AND AID
