1. **Scope and Content:** This collection consists of three scrapbooks of items collected by John A. Hindman, a veteran of the 122nd Pennsylvania Volunteer Infantry (PVI). Hindman, born in 1844, enlisted in the 122nd PVI on August 11, 1862. He was discharged for disability on February 7, 1863. After the conflict Hindman resided in Wilkensburg, Pennsylvania. He died on April 29, 1929, and is buried in Homewood Cemetery in Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania. The collection of clippings includes nearly 3,000 items related to various aspects of the conflict, veterans' gatherings, the Grand Army of the Republic, monument dedications, and politics. The inventory for this collection was

created by Emily Mullen, research assistant at Shenandoah University's McCormick Civil War Institute.
