Scope and Content: The letters in this collection cover a wide array of topics, related to the Civil War in the Shenandoah Valley and the operations of the Army of the Potomac in 1863 and 1864. The collection contains letters written by brothers Henry Holdeman and Felix Holdeman, both of whom served in Company B, 110th Ohio Volunteer Infantry. Henry Holdeman enlisted in the 110th Ohio on August 13, 1862. He was wounded at the Battle of the Wilderness, on May 5, 1864. He died from those wounds on June 15, 1864, in Alexandria, Virginia. He is buried in grave 2137, Alexandria National Cemetery. Felix Holdeman enlisted in the 110th Ohio on August 13, 1862. He was captured during the Second Battle of Winchester on June 15, 1863. Felix

Holdeman was wounded at the Battle of Cedar Creek on October 19, 1864. He mustered out of the regiment on July 7, 1865.
