

Service Opportunities for Martin Luther King Jr. Holiday 2024

Ideas that families can do on this day or any day:

- Coordinate a food and coat drive in your neighborhood. Invite neighbors to collect canned and boxed foods and/or coats and warm clothing in honor of MLK day. These can be dropped off at several different locations (below). Check each website for specific items needed and days/times for drop-offs.

- Make hygiene and necessity kits to support people without homes in your community.
 These can include things like toothbrush and toothpaste, deodorant, soap, comb or hairbrush, lotion, shampoo, feminine products. You can pack sets of items in ziplock bags. These can also be dropped off at one of the organizations listed above.
- Spend the day of service in your local park or other green space picking up trash and making efforts to make your community more beautiful and accessible to all.
- Start a friends and family Relay for Life Team and plan to join our Winchester/Frederick County/Shenandoah University Relay for Life event on March 22, 2024 in the Wilkins Athletic and Events Center
- Check on your neighbors, friends, and family, especially those who are older or may be alone. A phone call, text, or a conversation through the door could brighten their day.
- If you don't mind waiting until February to do your family service project, consider signing
 up as a team to participate in the Coldest Night of the Year walk on February 24 to
 support the WATTS program (Winchester Area Temporary Transitional Shelter)

- Engage your family in a clean-out day right in your own home, selecting furniture, appliances and home decor items that you no longer use or need. Donate these items to the Blue Ridge Habitat for Humanity <u>ReStore</u>, where they can be used to generate funds to help provide affordable homeownership opportunities in our local area.
- Spend some time on this holiday researching our area's local non-profits and learning
 about the ones that serve in the areas that you are passionate about. Commit to
 volunteering for one of them in 2023, or make a one-time or recurring donation to
