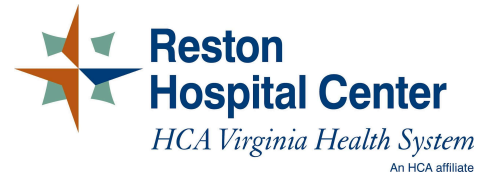

RESIDENCY OVERVIEW

The PGY1 Pharmacy Residency is conducted by Reston Hospital Center in Reston, Virginia. Reston Hospital Center is a 247-bed community hospital located near Washington, DC. The purpose of the PGY1 Pharmacy Residency Program at Reston Hospital Center is to build on Doctor of Pharmacy (Pharm.D.) education and outcomes to contribute to the development of clinical pharmacists responsible for medication related care of patients with a wide range of conditions, eligible for board certification, and eligible for postgraduate year two (PGY2) pharmacy residency training. The emphasis of this residency is on the impact of pharmacists and pharmacy leadership on patient care in the hospital setting, through a multidisciplinary approach. Residents gain a well-rounded and real-world experience of providing pharmaceutical care in a community hospital as well as the importance of providing education to patients and other health care professionals. With our affiliation with Shenandoah University, the residents are able to participate in a teaching certificate program and gain experience in lecturing, as well as precepting pharmacy students.
