

Build Foundations for the Next Generation

The generosity of Wilbur Dove '59 and his wife, Clare, has transformed Shenandoah's campus. The couple donated funds for the construction of two residential buildings in The Village – Dove's Nest and Dove's Nest II – and the Doves provided a \$20 million gift – Shenandoah's largest ever – toward a new creative arts center.

The Doves have also provided additional assistance to students by creating an endowed scholarship in the name of Wilbur's roommate and lifelong friend, the Rev. Bruce Gearhart, and by contributing to the Dayton Alumni Scholarship.
